

2015/09/00 – Texada Island. Thought it was a Man in a Ghillie

Suit: Two brothers deer hunting at Anderson Bay on Texada Island during September 2015 saw a strange figure about 30 feet away. The time was close to midnight with a bright almost full moon; they had a “FireFly” lantern/stove going for additional light and coffee. The entity was simply standing there with one arm against a tree. The men had previously heard sounds like wood-knocking or branches breaking which prompted them to look around. Their immediate impression was that the figure was a man in a hunters’ ghillie suit (a type of camouflage clothing designed to resemble the background environment such as foliage, snow or sand). They looked intently and noted that the figure was about 6 feet tall. It had the color of dark hair, and the skin on the face was dark; the face was ape-like but “flat.” The eyes appeared “animal-like.” They observed the entity for about 20 seconds whereupon it simply walked away on two legs into the bush. They noticed an unpleasant odor after it was gone. The two hunters decided not to stay in the area and left. One of the men notified a government conservation officer on the island of the strange incident.

NOTE: A Ghillie suit would certainly make a man look like a sasquatch; however, if a man wearing such came in contact with other hunters he would immediately make his identity known, especially at night.
