THE DALLES, Ore.—Within the vast forest widerness of the Pacific Northwest there may laye a species of sky, furry manifect creatures, perhaps relict and declining survivers from a time before modern man avolved.

And then again there may not.

A remarkable body of evidence has been gathered over the last few years that points either to the reality of a species of large primates known as Bigfoot or Sasquatch that walks on two lags or to a long series of hallucingsions and extraordinary houses executed with anatomical and scological expertise and with unusual restraint.

The evidence has persuaded at least one physical anthropologist of international standing that the Sasquatch phenomenon of footprints and sightings is real and in need of further study.

There is even speculation that a presumably



DETAILS:

The 7/6/75 issue of the Washington Star-News carried cutline and photograph (attached) captioned, "Recognition at Last:" concerning the recently published U.S. Army Corps of Engineers "Washington Environment Atlas." The Atlas contained information regarding the possible existence of Sasquatch, aka "Bigfoot," the legendary creature of the Pacific Northwest mountains.

This Atlas reported that "a sample of reputed Sasquatch hair was analyzed by the FBI and found to belong to no known animal." Inasmuch as FBI Laboratory experts had no records or recollection of such an examination, Dr. Steve Rice, Editor of the Army Atlas was telephonically contacted in Seattle, Washington. After checking, Dr. Rice was unable to locate his source of the reported FBI hair examination.

By letter dated 8/26/76 Mr. Peter C. Byrne, Director, The Bigfoot Information Center and Exhibition, The Dalles, Oregon, inquired whether this reported FBI hair analysis was accurate. In my letter dated 9/10/76 Mr. Byrne was told the FBI Laboratory had no references to such an examination (copies attached).

By letter dated 11/24/76 Mr. Peter Byrne again corresponded with the FBI Laboratory enclosing a New York Times article dated 6/30/76 captioned. "Is it Bigfoot, Or Can It Be Just A Hoax?" (attached). The article contained a history of Bigfoot and the activities of Mr. Byrne and others connected with the mystery. Mr. Byrne's letter requested the FBI Laboratory examine and attempt to identify 15 hairs attached to a piece of skin.

According to the New York Times article, Mr. Byrne's five-year search for Bigfoot is supported by the Academy of Applied Science (AAS), Boston, Massachusetts, admission fees to his exhibit and small donations from other sources. The AAS is the chief sponsor of the current Loch Ness expedition in Scotland. AAS is listed in the Encyclopedia of Associations as being founded in 1962 and dedicated to applied science and engineering. It claims 300 members and one staff member.

The heirs which you recitify delivered to the Fit Laboratory on behalf of The Rigiost information Center and Exhibition have been examined by transmitted and incident light microscopy. The examination included a study of morphological characteristics such as rest structure, medullary structure and cuticle thickness in addition to scale casts. Also, the hairs were compared directly with heirs of known origin under a comparison microscope.

It was concluded as a result of these examinations that the hairs are of deer family origin.






