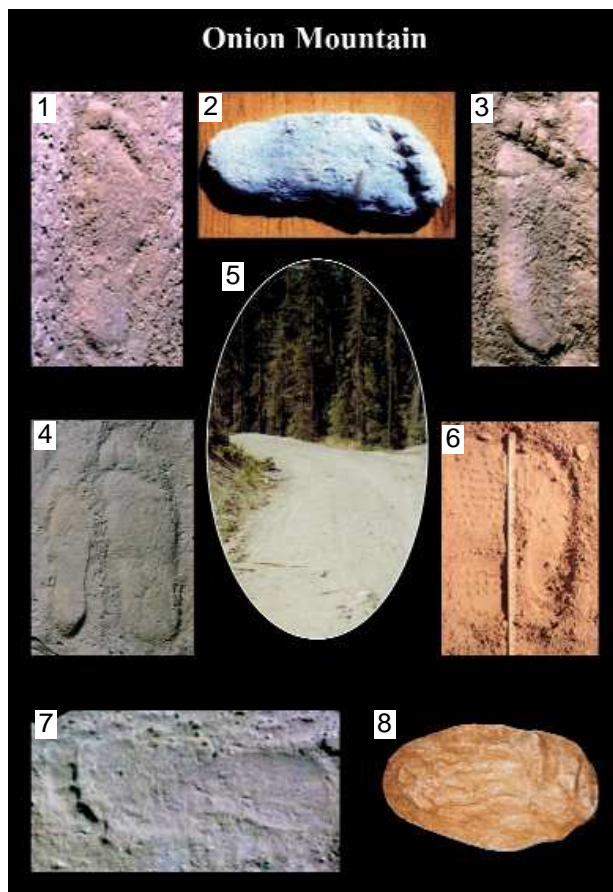


ONION MOUNTAIN



Onion Mountain is in the same region as Blue Creek Mountain. In 1967 John Green and René explored the mountain and found a footprint, about 9 inches long of which Green made a cast. They also found a print between 11 and 12 inches long which Green photographed.

In 1982 Bob Titmus was on the mountain and saw a hand print in a pool of water. He drained the pool and made a cast of the print, which measures about 12 inches long (tip of longest finger to the edge of the palm).

In about 2000 examination of the cast

Green made indicated that it might have dermal ridges; however subsequent research deemed this finding incorrect.

Onion Mountain faded from view until 2005 when a lady provided photographs taken of footprints found on the mountain also in 1967. It is believed the lady's parents (had the same last name) worked on a road-building crew in that year and took the photos. Years later, the parents said that on two occasions they saw Roger Patterson and Bob Gimlin in the area in 1967.

Examination of the prints provided in 2005 showed that there were two prints of different sizes— about 13 inches and 15 inches. It was also noted that in one image of the larger print, the same general configuration of the foot of the Patterson and Gimlin film sasquatch was evident. It is speculated that this sasquatch was on Onion Mountain either before or after it was seen along Bluff Creek.

The images seen are as follows:

1. A 15-inch print (1967) from the 2005 photos.
2. Cast Green made in 1967 an about 9-inch print.
3. A 13-inch print (1967) from the 2005 photos.
4. A 15-inch print (1967) with a shoe print from the 2005 photos.
5. The Onion Mountain Road looking down.
6. An 11-inch to 12-inch print found by Green and Dahinden in 1967.
7. A 15-inch print (1967) from the 2005 photos; matches P/G film sasquatch foot.
8. Hand cast made by Bob Titmus in 1982.
