

2009/SP/00 – Port Douglas, Harrison Lake. Large Rocks Tossed from 100 Feet: The night watchman at the Harrison Hydro work camp, Port Douglas, experienced strange events in September 2009. He heard whistles, screams and something crashing through the trees; on a couple of occasions large rocks were tossed at him from about 100 feet. They were tossed when his back was to the forest and he estimated their weight to be about ten pounds each. They landed about 20 to 30 feet from where he was standing. On the night that he heard the whistles and screams, there were no bears in the area all night. This was odd because he always sees one or two bears on his rounds. During one of his patrols, he found large human-like footprints in the sand by the lake. One of his duties is to keep bears out of the camp, so he is well-aware of the tracks left by these animals. He also noted that he knows about bear tracks “double tracking” and the human-like prints he saw were definitely not of this nature; there were no claws evident as with bear tracks. He mentioned the incidents to local residents and one told him that the work camp is on a route used by sasquatch.
