2011/09/21 – Deroche. Appeared to have a Deformed Mouth: A First Nations lady resident of Deroche heard her neighbor's dogs howling very strangely on September 21, 2011 at about 4:00 p.m. and went to investigate. She walked around her trailer and sensed a pungent odor. As she looked from left to right she saw what she called a bigfoot at about 50 feet. She pointed at it and yelled something like, "You have got to get out of here; it's not safe, go away; it's not safe." The bigfoot made a turn, an almost sideway step, and walked away into the bush. The resident said that she was struck by the fact that it did not appear to have a neck and that its hair was very matted; tan or brown in color. She also noticed something very unusual; it appeared to have a deformed mouth—along the lines of a cleft lip, although she did not think this was the case: "mouth was deformed or hurt or something." She estimated its height to be about 6 feet; and its weight at over 350 pounds.

Thomas Steenburg did an intensive interview with the lady and although we can't rule out a homeless man in dark clothing; this does not appear to be the case. The lady and a friend showed up at my sasquatch exhibit at Yale during 2012; she certainly appeared very sincere.

Given the mouth deformity was a cleft lip, a check of the Internet on the occurrence of a cleft lip (incorrectly called a harelip) in non-human primates showed the following:

Cleft lip has been documented in several species of nonhuman primates, but much remains unknown about the occurrence of cleft lip and cleft palate in great apes, probably because such malformations are rare. (US National Library of Medicine; National Institutes of Health.)

We might consider here (below) that the condition is quite prevalent in humans:

Cleft lip and palate occurs in about 1 to 2 per 1,000 births in the developed world. Cleft lip is about twice as common in males as females. (Wikipedia).

NOTE: It needs to be kept in mind that many First Nations people are firm believers in sasquatch/bigfoot and are concerned about their welfare. This accounts for the resident's warning for the subject to go away.
