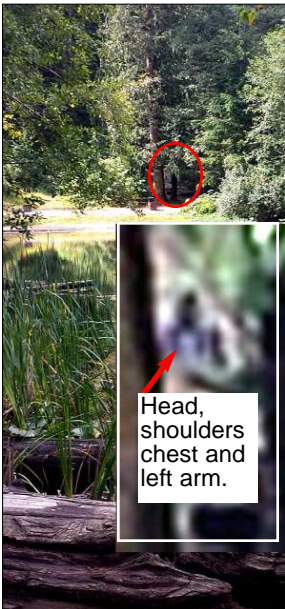


2014/08/21 – Weaver Lake. “Gorilla Walking Like a Man”: A lady glimpsed what she believes was a sasquatch at Weaver Lake (near Harrison Lake) on August 21, 2014 at about 10:30 a.m. The lady was out walking with her boyfriend when she saw a figure coming down a trail at a considerable distance. She thought it was odd because it appeared like a gorilla. It was all black, but appeared to have bare patches on its chest. She described it as “a gorilla walking like a man.” She alerted her boy friend to the oddity, but by the time he looked the subject had disappeared into the trees. Nevertheless, he had been taking scenery shots with his cell phone camera in the direction of the figure, and when they checked the images something or someone can be seen in one of the shots (provided below). Later, the lady called Thomas Steenburg and he interviewed her. The next day, Steenburg and Brad Trent went to the location and did a thorough investigation. Photographs were taken of both men at the spot where the oddity was seen from about the distance of the shots taken by the boyfriend. In the resulting images both men appeared as tall, or taller than the subject. It was seen that close to the spot where the figure was observed there is a large bear-proof garbage container. It has been reasoned that what the lady saw was a person dressed in black using the container or simply in that area. The lady does not rule this out, but feels that what she saw was very odd (like a gorilla).



The cell phone photograph taken by the boyfriend with the oddity identified in the enlarged inset. Research indicated that there was definitely something (human or otherwise) at the specific spot when the photograph was taken, and that it was well under 6 feet tall. The trail the subject was traveling led into a campsite location. That the oddity did not continue on the trail might be answered by reasoning that it was someone going to a nearby garbage container hidden by the forest.
